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## 1. INTRODUCTION

This activity aims at facilitating high quality and innovative transnational learning. LTTAs will be the space in which students can directly interact with the contents by the use of the tools, resources and tools. They are also spaces destined to the communication and information exchanged among students from different countries.

Therefore, it is important to generate a structured environment, socio-cultural interaction, where participants take ownership of knowledge, skills and values from the pedagogical model that supports it to guarantee proper operation of accessible educational resources on an actual operating environment.

In this way, LTTAs have a triple value:

- 1) Demonstrating the intellectual outputs quality and their impact in attending learners.
- 2) Achieving of project objectives.
- 3) Improving partners' competencies.

The students will carry out an intensive work based experience in Spain with the double purpose to enrich theoretical competences with practical skills and to pilot the first parts of intellectual outputs (O1: Methodological guide, O2: e-learning course and O3: educational multiplatform), developing part of the first study of case.

## **RESULTS**

- Understanding how the citizens of Castellón and its region conceive “water”.
- Increase technical competencies and ICT skills (theoretical and practical activities).
- Creation of a database of the hydraulic heritage of Castellón.
- The pilot activities will test parts I and II of the methodological guide, the first part of the e-learning course and deliverable 1 of the educational multiplatform. Thus, suggestions and bugs detection (if any) will be given to improve these intellectual outputs.
- Improvement of soft skills such as technical English language, interpersonal and intercultural competences, team-work and self-developing skills, etc.



## 2. GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE CITY (Castellón, Spain).

Castellón de la Plana, a city where 180.000 people live, is in the east of Spain, with an amazing climate its inhabitants of this city are very friendly.

There are three main areas that can be distinguished: the historic central nucleus, the new modern neighborhoods and, touching the sea, the Grau or the harbour. The historic center, where we can perceive the shape of Roman camp, has the most significant historical ensembles and museums. This primitive nucleus was born on the ancient arabic farmhouses after the founding population permission given by Jaime I in the thirteenth century. Cultural and sports facilities have been created in the residential suburbs. Finally, by the sea, is the Grau district, where life related to all sea activities and our magnificent beaches is concentrated.

The Millars River is the most important river course in the Province of Castellón, both in flow and in length. The towns of the entire Mijares basin have prospered from an agrarian economy based on the use of its waters through a culture in the form of ditches, canalizations, etc ... that the Romans, Muslims and Christians have left us. In addition, in the river Mijares you can carry out innumerable activities both in winter and in summer. We can highlight the magnificent bathing areas and water activities such as kayaking.

### RULES IN ALBERGUE ARGENTINA

1. Albergue Argentina closes by **24:00h**. From this time on you may access through the main entrance. From 23:30h to 8:00h all guests must maintain their noise volume low to ensure everyone's rest.
2. When the stay has finished, everything in the room and the room itself must be in the same conditions as they were found. If anything is broken and must be repaired or replaced, these costs will not be covered by Albergue Argentina. Before leaving the room all the dirty sheets and towels must be taken out and placed in the cages destined for this.
3. The responsible of each group will be in charge of collecting and giving back all the keys.

### PROHIBITIONS:

- Smoking, entering and / or consuming alcoholic beverages and any narcotic.
- Taking bedding, mattresses, furniture and / or belongings out of the rooms.
- Store and prepare food in the rooms.
- The installation of refrigerators, microwaves, burners, heaters and other electrical appliances or any fuel.
- The entry of pets, except guide dogs.

## 6. COVID PROTOCOL

### **Additional requirements established by the Authorities due to the situation of the COVID pandemic that will be applied in the Erasmus+ Project**

1.- It will be mandatory to comply with the measures that at the time of arrival in Spain are in force. Participants will be informed of these measures upon arrival.

2.- The use of a mask will be mandatory throughout the duration of the activities programmed, including those carried out abroad, since due to their type of the and due to the number of participants, the minimum distance required by the Authorities cannot always be guaranteed.

3.- During scheduled activities, meals and free time we cannot ensure that there is not any contact between participants. This implies that if any of them tested positive in a PCR test, it is likely that him/her/them should remain isolated in quarantine for the time determined by the Authorities.

Therefore, it will be mandatory to have the European vaccination certificate to avoid a PCR test.

In case of non-compliance with this last indication, any economic cost or academic damage of any type that entails the quarantine imposed on the participant that gives positive (and the rest of the participants who are considered contacts by the Health Authorities), will be borne by the participant who tests positive. In case of non-compliance with this indication, also pre-flight PCR tests and to participate in some of the activities must be borne by the participant.

If, by any case it is necessary for a student or group of students to remain in Spain to serve a quarantine, the centers will be in charge of managing all aspects with their families.
